#### **Did You Know?**

You can play a role in keeping our community safe by registering your home security cameras with Gwinnett County! The process is quick and simple at gwinnettsafecommunities.org.

#### Here's how it works:

• Voluntary program: You choose whether or not to participate.



- No live access: Police do not have access to your cameras or live feed.
- On-call support: If a crime happens near your home, investigators can see that you have a camera and may contact you to request video footage.

This program helps Gwinnett County Police identify where cameras are located, saving time during investigations and increasing the chance of solving crimes. Even a small piece of footage can provide the missing link.

Taking just a few minutes to register could make a big difference in protecting our neighborhood!

## **Spiced Snack Mix**

**Ingredients:** 

3 1/2 cups mini pretzels 2 cups toasted corn squares cereal (we used Corn Chex)

2 cups cheese crackers
6 Tbsp. unsalted butter, melted
1/4 cup sunflower seeds
2 Tbsp. sesame seeds
1 Tbsp. black sesame seeds
1 Tbsp. dried minced onion
1 tsp. caraway seeds
1 tsp. dried parsley
1/2 tsp. cracked black pepper

Step 1: Heat oven to 300°F. Line 2 large rimmed baking sheets with parchment paper. Step 2: In large bowl, toss pretzels, cereal, and crackers with melted butter to coat, then toss with sunflower seeds, sesame seeds, onion, caraway seeds, parsley, and pepper.

Step 3: Arrange mixture in even layer on prepared baking sheets and bake, tossing once, until lightly toasted in spots, about 20 minutes. Let cool, then serve or store in airtight container up to 1 week.

**Chrysanthemums (Mums)** 


