Pool Season Starts Here: 2026 Registration Is Open!

The 2026 pool registration for the Smoketree Swim & Recreation Club is officially open!

Members can register today by visiting <https://smoketree.us>. Returning members can log in using the same account information from last season and simply confirm their contact details, membership type, and payment information.

After reviewing the upcoming season, the SSRC Board is happy to share that most membership rates remain the same for 2026. Even better, the Single membership rate has been lowered to \$295, making it even easier for individuals to enjoy the club this summer.

2026 Membership Rates

- Household (up to 5 members) – \$575*
- Duo (2 members) – \$475
- Single (18+) – \$295
- Civic – \$125

**Up to three additional household members may be added for \$50 each (after the first five).*

WastePro Truck Fire

On Friday, March 6th, an unusual and concerning incident occurred in the neighborhood involving a WastePro recycling truck.

While traveling down Wedgewood during the normal recycling route, something combusted inside the recycling truck, causing the entire load to catch fire. For safety reasons, the driver had to dump the burning contents into the road, where a large pile of recycling and trash burned until the Gwinnett County Fire Rescue arrived to extinguish the flames.

For safety reasons, the driver had to dump the burning contents into the road, where a large pile of recycling and trash burned until the Gwinnett County Fire Rescue arrived to extinguish the flames.

The incident left a large pile of burnt debris in the roadway for several hours while Waste Pro arranged for equipment to safely remove it. A bulldozer was eventually brought in to clear the damaged material and reopen the road.

Situations like this typically occur when combustible or hazardous items are placed in recycling bins. While it's impossible to know whether the item came from our neighborhood or a surrounding area, it serves as an important reminder to be mindful about what goes into recycling containers.

Items That Should NOT Be Placed in Recycling Bins

Please avoid placing the following items in your recycling:

- Batteries (especially lithium-ion and rechargeable batteries)
- Propane tanks or small gas cylinders
- Aerosol cans that still contain product
- Electronics or devices containing batteries
- Flammable liquids (paint, gasoline, solvents)
- Chemicals or household hazardous waste
- Fireworks or explosives



These materials can ignite or react when compacted inside recycling trucks, creating dangerous situations for drivers, emergency responders, and the community.

If you are unsure whether an item is recyclable or hazardous, it's always best to check local disposal guidelines or take the item to a proper hazardous waste facility.

Easy Pasta Salad

- 3 cups uncooked fusilli pasta
- 2 heaping cups halved cherry tomatoes
- 1½ cups cooked chickpeas, drained and rinsed

- 3 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
- 1 teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 teaspoon herbes de Provence or dried Italian seasoning,
